The garden has a wonderful background of established trees that have been used as the backbone of the garden Kay has created over the last 30 odd years. PROJECT NEWS AND ACTIVITIES

GLEN INNES FARMERS LEADING NATURAL CAPITAL BENCHMARKING PROJECT

Natural capital for farmers was the topic of discussion at GLENRAC's recent Focus event at the Glen Innes Services Club.

40 people attended the evening to learn about natural capital – what natural capital is, the existing legislation around natural assets in Australia and the challenges and opportunities for farmers in this space.

The evening included talks from key figures across the agriculture, government and finance sector regarding existing, or lack thereof, natural capital policies in Australia and possible avenues for natural assets in the future.

The evening also provided an overview of GLENRAC's recent farm pilot project *Benchmarking Natural Capital*, a twelve month project aimed at building capacity for farmers to measure and monitor the condition of their farm's natural capital and public good natural resource management outcomes.

Funded by the Australian Government Future Drought Fund and led by Dr Williams and GLENRAC,

the *Benchmarking Natural Capital* project engaged 6 pilot farms in the Glen Innes region in a scientific study to measure and monitor natural capital over the 2021-2022 financial year. The study participants utilised GIS mapping data and other online systems to collect data that informed a natural capital baseline of the property.

PROJECT NEWS AND ACTIVITIES SHOT IN THE DARK - NIGHT VISION & THERMAL IMAGING

As part of an integrated pest animal management program shooting is important, and the technology to help make shooting more efficient and effective is rapidly evolving. GLENRAC held two Shot in the Dark events in late August highlighting night vision and thermal imaging technology. Rob Hunt, NSW National Parks & Wildlife, joined the event via Zoom and gave a comprehensive presentation on the application and suitability of night vision and thermal imaging scopes. monoculars and binoculars for a range of different pest animals and situations. He

talked about what technology

would be most effective for

different situations and what

to consider when looking at purchasing this kind of equipment.

Tim Luetiens and Joe Lien from ExtraVision in Brisbane travelled down for the events at Stonehenge and Deepwater and brought along a wide range of both night vision and thermal imaging gear. Tim talked about the use and suitability of the various equipment, how to achieve the best value solutions for a variety of situations and then everyone had the opportunity to have a look at and through the gear, spotting rabbits and a fox slinking through the next paddock.
