

QUAD BIKES REBATES (BACKGROUND)



- Since 2001, over 280 persons have died as a result of quad bike use on Australian farms.
- Thousands more have been seriously injured.
- 20% of these fatalities were children under the age of 16.
- Fatalities that occur on-farm are mostly due to rollover or head trauma.

Rollover protective devices

MANDATORY FOR NEW AND SECONDHAND IMPORTED BIKES ON

OCTOBER 11

REBATES

Quad bikes

- Up to \$2000 total for eligible business
- \$2000, side by side
- Up to \$600 for rollover protective device
- Up to \$90 for helmet, including workers
- Up to \$500 for eligible drone (one per ABN)

Small business Rebate

- Up to \$500
- 50 workers or less
- Business registered in NSW with an ABN
- Any eligible safety item (check with us if in doubt)

REMOTE WORK

Issues

- Unable to communicate to request assistance if an incident occurs
- First Aid unavailable
- Exposure to the elements
- No mobile phone reception
- First responders unable to find you





REMOTE WORK

Solutions

- Tell another person where you are going and what time you'll be back
- Schedule call back times to home base (Have a "Call in Plan")
- Always carry a first aid kit and water with you
- Carry a mobile phone with you
- Consider installing Cell Fi on your vehicle to improve mobile phone reception
- Consider using a satellite phone
- Have a UHF fitted to your vehicle
- Consider carrying an EPIRB (Emergency position indicating radio beacon) or PLB (Personal Locator Beacon)

Both must be registered with the Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA)



Legislation and PCBU responsibilities

- Work Health and Safety Act 2011, s38 'Duty to notify notifiable incidents'
- In NSW the PCBU has a responsibility to report all notifiable incidents to SafeWork NSW
- Ring SafeWork NSW on 13 10 50



What is a notifiable incident?

- The death of a person
- A serious injury or illness of a person
- A potentially dangerous incident



What is a serious injury?

- A serious injury or illness of a person that requires
- a) to have immediate treatment as an in patient in a hospital or,
- b) immediate treatment for an amputation, serious head injury, eye injury, burn, degloving or scalping, spinal injury, loss of bodily function, serious laceration or,
- c) medical treatment within 48 hours of exposure to a substance



What is a dangerous incident?

- An incident at a workplace that exposes a worker or any other person to a serious risk to a persons health and safety from an immediate or imminent exposure to -
- Uncontrolled escape, spillage or leakage of a substance,
- Uncontrolled implosion, explosion or fire,
- Uncontrolled escape of gas or steam, pressurised substance,
- Electric shock,
- Fall from a height of any plant or substance,
- Overturning of plant,
- Collapse or partial collapse of a structure
- Collapse or failure of an excavation of any shoring supporting an excavation



PCBU duties

- Call 000 if emergency services are required
- Call SafeWork NSW and report the incident on 13 10 50
- PCBU must not disturb the incident site until an inspector arrives or at an earlier time if an inspector directs

What happens next?

- Job is triaged by customer service
- Customer service will decide whether it will require an inspector response
- If an inspector response is determined, an inspector will attend the workplace and commence the investigation
