MEAT CAMPAIGN GOES GREEN

Meat + Livestock Australia is launching a new campaign to tell consumers their meat is produced by farmers who care for the environment. About 100 cattle + sheep farmers have joined the campaign to talk about their farming practices in social media + online forums. The campaign will also be screened on Qantas in-flight entertainment + in cinemas.

RABBIT CONTROL RESEARCH

NSW Scientists have been screening more than 100 overseas strains of the rabbit calicivirus in a bid to come up with a more effective biological control agent. Rabbits cause about \$200 million worth of damage across Australia annually. Scientists at Elizabeth Macarthur Agricultural Institute are working with overseas labs and also CSIRO through the program. It's hoped the new virus strain will prove more effective and spread more effectively.
