ACTION ON THE GROUND

Action on the Ground is a component of the <u>Carbon</u> <u>Farming Futures Program</u> and will invest up to \$99 million of grant funding over six years to June 2017.

Action on the Ground assists farmers and land managers to undertake on-farm trials of abatement technologies, practices and management strategies to measure and demonstrate how these can reduce agricultural greenhouse gas emissions of methane and nitrous oxide or increase the sequestration of carbon in soil while maintaining farm productivity.

Under round two, individual grants up to \$775 000 (GST Exclusive) are available for farmers, land managers, farming groups, researchers, industry sectors and nongovernment organisations to undertake projects that address at least one of the program's three key priorities:

- reduced methane emissions from livestock production systems
- reduced nitrous oxide emissions
- increased carbon sequestration in soils

COMMUNITY ENVIRONMENT GRANTS NOW OPEN

Community Environment Grants of between \$5000 and \$50,000 are now available from the Australian Government to community groups working to achieve an environment that is healthier, better protected, well managed and resilient.

Funding is available to established and emerging groups currently operating in the environmental sector, including Indigenous organisations.

Individuals are not eligible to apply for Community Environment Grants.

Community Environment Grants will assist community based organisations to contribute to three strategic objectives, under the Sustainable Environment Stream of Caring for our Country:

1. Maintenance of ecosystem services, including ecological and cultural values, now and into the future;

Recommendations include increasing the quality and availability of natural hazard mapping; more flexible land use planning regulations, and clarifying the roles, responsibilities and legal liability of local governments, and improving their capacity to manage climate risks.
