FAIRFAX MEDIA CLOSING DOWN AG PUBLICATIONS

Fairfax Media has closed three titles in its agricultural media division, including 109-year-old Australian Horticultural Magazine, and others are said to be under review. Australian Farm Journal (AFJ) and the online-only Australian Landcare Magazine have also been shut down as of May 31, with the current, June, issue to be the final one of each. Former AFJ editor Patrick Francis said he was leaving the company and that the magazine's advertising manager had been made redundant. Mr Francis told Media he had been informed the magazine

was being closed "for commercial reasons".
"Put another way, it's non-profitable," he said. "It is disappointing to close after such a long period of time because we had a niche area of media publication in the agricultural sector, but things need to pay their way."

KFC is switching from frying poultry pieces in Malaysiansourced palm oil to locally grown canola oil — the demand from KFC's 610 stores for the high-oleic oil will aenerate tens of millions of dollars in the farm sector international canola prices are already nearly 3 times wheat prices due to a sharp rise in the demand from China and to European demand for biodiesel - this is leading farmers to plant a record canola crop AFR 140512.

\$150,000 in funding is being made available to farming groups and organisations to support projects that will improve water use, nutrient management or the carbon footprint of farming through the Woolworths Fresh Food Future program.
