There is no age limit and students could be studying anything from education, engineering, health, agriculture, business and anything in between.

The Scholarships offer \$5,000 for full-time study and \$2,500 for part-time study to assist students from rural areas who in turn are motivated to help build strong and vibrant communities.

Who can apply?

Incorporated not-for-profit community organisations and local councils.

What are the grants for?

To fund the <u>building and improvement</u> of <u>local community facilities</u>.

Community infrastructure projects which are intended to commemorate the Centenary of ANZAC 2014 - 2018 may be submitted.

How much is available?

Grant funding of \$200,000 will be made available for every electoral district with an additional \$100,000 for electorates identified with higher unemployment rates.

How do I apply?

Applications must be made online through the link on this website. Applications must be submitted within the application period. Late applications will not be accepted.

How are applications assessed?

Grants applications will be assessed competitively on merit against the Project Assessment Criteria with other projects in the State electoral district

MOBILE MAPPING PEST ANIMALS

Farmers and communities can now use mobile phones to map pest animals and note the damage they cause in their local area into the popular website FeralScan using the latest technology produced by the Invasive Animals CRC.

The FeralScan citizen science program currently hosts more than 20,000 pest animal records entered by landholders and communities across Australia. Having this technology now going mobile will dramatically increase the value of FeralScan for landholders and communities coordinating on-ground control programs.
