Grants ranging between \$5000 and \$50 000 are available to support local sustainable agriculture and community engagement projects, as part of the Australian Government's \$2.2 billion Caring for our Country initiative.

Community Landcare Grants make it possible for local community-based groups to take action to help achieve a sustainable, productive, profitable and resilient agricultural base.

Community Landcare Grants aim to help: build a skilled and capable Landcare community, encourage community participation and engagement in Landcare, share information and learning in sustainable agricultural techniques, reduce the spread of pest species, & encourage the adoption of improved sustainable land management practices.

Organisations involved with Landcare, professional farming systems or Indigenous groups are encouraged to apply.

The grants are also designed to increase participation of young people, women, Indigenous Australians and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds in natural resource management and sustainable agriculture activities. These groups are also encouraged to apply.

CONSERVATION TILLAGE REFUNDABLE TAX OFFSET

Primary producers who purchase new conservation seeding equipment and receive а Research Participation Certificate can apply for a 15 per cent refundable tax offset (RTO). This initiative is designed to encourage conservation tillage practices in Australian agriculture. PEST ANIMAL CONTROL & LANDHOLDER TRAINING DAY'S

Maximise your pest animal control efforts. The training day will include information on identifing signs of pest animals: wild dogs, foxes, feral pigs and feral cats, use different bait preparation and placement techniques, sensor trail cameras: what's available and what benefit are they, & undertake effective monitorina and record keeping.
