WIN A KITCHEN FOR YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY RAS Foundation 2013 Community Kitchen Program Now Open

The Royal Agricultural Society of NSW (RAS) Foundation is giving rural and regional NSW community organisations the chance to win a kitchen worth \$25,000 courtesy of Bunnings Warehouse. A new program for 2013, applications are open for the 2013 RAS Foundation Community Kitchen.

Officer, Jocellin Jansson said that the kitchen would be a wonderful boost for a rural community. "Each year at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, **Bunnings Warehouse constructs** a large working kitchen that is used for cooking demonstrations in the Woolworths Fresh Food Dome. Now, thanks to the support of Bunnings Warehouse, this same kitchen will provide a much needed boost to a deserving rural NSW community once the Show finishes," said Ms Jansson. "There are many community buildings or community facilities in rural and regional towns that could transformed with a new kitchen, turning them into a more useable and functional facility for the whole community to use for a range of events and activities. It's important to both Bunnings Warehouse and the RAS Foundation that the kitchen can be used by many in the community." The donated kitchen includes all of the cabinetry, cook tops, sink and oven, as well as a smaller kitchen, suitable for use indoors our outside undercover. Applicants are asked to answer a series of questions explaining why their community needs a new kitchen, who would utilise the kitchen and how it would enhance their community. Those eligible to apply include community centres, welfare organisations, churches, men's sheds, service clubs, sporting clubs, CWA branches and s h o w societies. The inaugural winner of the RAS Foundation Community Kitchen Award will be announced in March, with presentation to take place during the Sydney Royal Easter Show, 21 March - 3 April. "The kitchen is the heart of the family home and now, the RAS Foundation Community Kitchen program is enabling this great modern **Bunnings** lookina kitchen to become the heart of a local rural NSW community," said M s Jansson. The successful organisation will be responsible for freighting the kitchen from Sydney and associated installation costs. Applications close 10 February. 2013. AUSTRALIA'S NATURAL RESOURCES ARE 'IN SAFE HANDS'

Landcare volunteers will be the beneficiaries of a \$302,500 grant to ensure they remain "in safe hands". Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry, Senator Joe Ludwig, said the grant would be used to fund the delivery of a Landcare work health and safety package, "In Safe Hands".

"In Safe Hands will help ensure the safety of the most valuable asset the Landcare movement has – our volunteers," Minister Ludwig said.

"There are more than 100,000 Landcare volunteers across

Australia playing an important role in our natural resource management.

"The In Safe Hands training package is about supporting those groups and volunteers to improve their health and safety practices on the ground."

Minister Ludwig said the management system and training package was developed by, and would be delivered by, Conservation Volunteers Australia.

"The training will be delivered to more than 500 Landcare and community groups across Australia through a series of training workshops in 2013," he said.

"It will help develop practical skills and ensure people understand their legal obligations. "We encourage people to play a role in natural resource management and this grant is about providing people with the work health and safety skills they need to do this."

Conservation Volunteers Australia has partnered with individuals, businesses and governments in the conservation of Australia's environment for more than 30 years.

Landcare is a community-based movement that has played a major role in raising awareness, influencing farming and land management practices and delivering environmental outcomes across Australian landscapes.

The Gillard Government has dedicated more than \$200 million to Landcare activities over the next five years through its Caring for our Country initiative.

This builds on the Government's \$178 million commitment for Landcare activities over the five years until June 2013.

COLES LAUNCHES PLASTIC RECYCLING FOR SCHOOLS INITIATIVE

Recyclable plastic tables and chairs will be making their way into Australian schools through an Australian-first recycling initiative run by Coles and Australian recycling company RED group.

Over the next few weeks the REDcycle program will be rolled out so that Coles' shoppers can hand plastic bags and soft plastic packaging back in to dedicated in-store bins instead of going into landfill. RED Group then collects and processes the plastic before sending it to Replas to melt the plastic down, pour it into moulds and make the furniture to be distributed to Australian schools.

After a successful trial in Victoria in late 2011 and 2012, the program will be rolled out in 370 Coles' city stores across Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane and Adelaide.

Coles Store Development and Operations Director Stuart Machin said "In little over 12 months in Melbourne alone. Coles' customers have ensured million plastic packaging items has been diverted from landfill as part of our trial. So by rolling this program out locally and across the nation, the potential benefits enormous," he said. RED Group of Development Director Elizabeth Kasell said the

initiative was particularly exciting because it involved consumers, retailers, distributors and manufacturers "all working together for a better end of life outcome for materials that were previously going to landfill."
