HAVE YOU HEARD ABOUT OZDOC?

The University of Melbourne has launched a "citizen science" program for volunteers, to help collate weather data to work out what Australia's natural climate was like before industrialisation in the 1950's. A pilot program has already unearthed extreme weather events, such as an inch of snow falling in inner-city Sydney in 1836.

Volunteers will get to look at the logbooks of the first fleet + various explorers, as well as old farm diaries. Researchers believe not enough is known about climate before the Bureau of Meteorology was established in 1908. Research will also include natural archives of tree rings, coral records + more.
