ENVIRONMENTAL TRUST OPENS

The NSW Government's Environmental Trust program has opened its Environmental Education + Protecting our Places programs. These programs support programs that are focused on educating the community on NRM issues. Protecting our Places aims to protect land that is culturally significant to Aboriginal people + support education projects about the environment and its importance in Aboriginal life. NEW PROGRAM FOR SCHOOLS

The Environmental Trust has established a new program under the Eco Schools program this year, Food Gardens in Schools. This program will be trialled for two funding rounds in 2012 + 2013. GREEN GLOBE AWARDS

Nominations are open for the NSW Government's Green Globe Awards - recognising environmental excellence, leadership + innovation in NSW. The awards are open to all businesses, individuals, state + local government + not-forprofit organisations that can demonstrate significant environmental achievements. Twelve categories are open for public nomination covering a range of energy efficiency, waste + environmental sustainability initiatives. The awards will be judged by a panel of independent experts. MINGOOLA SPOTS A GUDGEON

Students at Mingoola Public School have netted a rare 'Purple Spotted Gudgeon' while taking part in a Waterwatch day on the Severn River, facilitated by the Border Rivers-Gwydir CMA. The Purple Spotted Gudgeon is listed as an endangered species in NSW. Border Rivers-Gwydir CMA has established the Border Rivers Schools Waterwatch Network, to monitor water quality, biodiversity + the environmental health of local rivers. RESTORATION + REHAB ANNOUNCED

Successful applicants for the 2011 Restoration + Rehabilitation Grants have been announced by NSW Environmental Trust. A total of \$2.05 million funding has been awarded across NSW, with 24 grants provided. This includes Gwymac Landcare (Inverell) who will receive \$40,461 for an urban Landcare project, Linking Conservation, Kids + Community at Ross Hill, Inverell.

NFF SUBMISSION

The National Farmers' Federation (NFF) has released its submission to the Australian Government's Energy White Paper, reinforcing the importance of affordable fuel + energy to the long-term competitiveness of Australia's agricultural sector. The NFF submission also raises concerns about increased costs of energy emerging from the carbon tax + changes to state utility ownership regimes.
