BIODIVERSITY FUND

The Australian Government has committed to reducing Australia's carbon emissions by between 5 and 25 per cent by 2020. This is known as the Clean Energy Future Plan. Under the program, the Federal Government has launched the Biodiversity Fund. This will provide \$946.2 million over the first 6 years to land managers to undertake projects that establish, restore, protect or manage biodiverse carbon stores. Included in eligible projects are those that have actions to prevent the spread of invasive species.

ACTION ON THE GROUND

This new grant is offered by the Federal Government and aims to support farmers to reduce on farm agricultural emission of greenhouse gases and / or increase carbon sequestered in the soil. This is part of the Carbon Farming Futures Program + will invest \$99 million over 6 years through a series of grant rounds.

Examples of eligible projects include animal management and feed strategies to reduce methane emissions; management strategies to reduce nitrous oxide emissions; planting rotational crops for increasing soil carbon + more. CARING FOR OUR COUNTRY BUSINESS PLAN

The 2012-2013 Business Plan has been released. This is the Federal Government's flagships NRM funding program. Due to the CFOC program being wrapped up June 2013, applications being sought are 12 months duration. Priority areas include Sustainable Farming Practices, Biodiversity and Increasing Knowledge + Skills. The online application form is now available at www.nrm.gov.au

CHAIRS APPOINTED

The NSW Government has announced 9 new Chairs for Catchment Management Authorities in NSW. This includes Northern Rivers appointed Chair John Williams.

Recruitment for the Chair positions in Namoi and Border Rivers-Gwydir regions is continuing.

FLOOD FUNDING

Border Rivers-Gwydir CMA has released a Flood Recovery Funding program. This targets landholders who were flood affected by January 2011 flooding. This includes areas of Yetman-Bonshaw-Tenterfield. Applicants will need to be able to provide evidence of the damage caused. Types of projects suitable for funding include regeneration / revegetation; fencing rivers + creeks; eradication of weeds (WONS), improving groundcover.
