Filling the Research Gap is a component of the Australian Government's Carbon Farming Futures program. The program will see \$201 million invested in research to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the land and agriculture sector. This can include projects to focus on research

# STOCK ROUTES HOME TO DIVERSE FAUNA

Border Rivers-Gwydir CMA has funded a 14 day fauna study of Travelling Stock Routes in the Gurley-Bellata area. The study was conducted by Phil Spark, and revealed 145 native animals on TSRs in the area. This also included vulnerable + threatened species, such as Earless Dragons, the Grey Crowned Babbler, Spotted Harrier + Bush Stone Curlew. Stock Routes remain key conservation areas for threatened species, meaning threats such as vertebrate pests + weed species need to be carefully managed.

# FARM COUNSELLING SERVICE EXPANDS

Anglicare Northern Inland has secured funding from the Australian Government to expand its counselling services for landholders in the Bundarra region. The service is predominantly for landholders who continue to experience the impact of drought in their lives. Services will be available in Bundarra once per fortnight

#### ROADSIDE VEG FUNDING

The NSW Government has allocated \$1.3 million in funding for council roadside vegetation conservation projects. Councils are able to apply for up to \$50,000 to help conserve and protect roadside vegetation through revegetating and regeneration of ecological communities.
