# PRIMARY INDUSTRIES SET TO GRASP OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN A CHANGING CLIMATE

Farmers, researchers and key stakeholders will come together to discuss climate change and agriculture at the 2012 Climate Change Research Strategy for Primary Industries (CCRSPI) Conference. The Melbourne-based conference is Australia's only dedicated primary industries and climate change forum.

Emissions in agriculture features heavily in the program and Dr Jude Capper, sustainability consultant and Adjunct Professor of Animal Sciences at Washington State University, will discuss sustainability in the livestock industry. Additionally, Ben Keogh from Australian Carbon Traders and Fiona Robertson from Department of Primary Industries Victoria will be discussing soil carbon.

Delegates will also hear from social commentator and demographer, Bernard Salt; University of Melbourne's Professor Ross Garnaut and Professor Richard Eckard; CSIRO's Sustainable Agriculture Flagship's Brian Keating; and producers and sustainable farming advocates Lucinda Corrigan and Sam Archer.

Early bird registrations are open until 28 September. In partnership with the conference platinum sponsor, the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry, CCRSPI is pleased to offer travel bursaries and conference fee subsidies for a limited number of farmers and farm consultants/advisors.

## NEW CUSTOMER-FOCUSED LOCAL LAND SERVICES

Local Land Services will be regionally-based, semi-autonomous, statutory organisations, which are governed by locally elected and skills-based Board members, delivering services for farmers and landowners.

From January 2014, Local Land Services will deliver functions currently provided by 13 Catchment Management Authorities (CMAs) and Livestock Health & Pest Authorities (LHPAs) and agriculture advisory services of Agriculture NSW (part of the Department of Primary Industries).

The new Local Land Services will deliver agricultural advice, plant and animal pest control and biosecurity, natural resource management and emergency + disaster assessment and response.

One central Local Land Services Board of Chairs will be made up of representatives from each regional organisation and will be accountable to the Minister for Primary Industries.

Each Local Land Service will develop operational management plans that will prioritise service delivery on a regional basis, reflecting regional priorities.

Individual Local Land Services will be independently audited to ensure accountability and delivery against priorities.

Local Land Services will be funded via direct budget contributions from the NSW Government, ratepayer funds and a continuation of natural resource grant funding via the State Government and Australian Government.

Local Land Services will integrate advisory services, enable strong representation by local service users, reduce administrative costs, improve management of region-specific issues, enhance transparency and accountability + deliver better outcomes for State and regional priorities.

The new Local Land Services will be operational in January 2014. Landowners will still be able to access existing services from DPI, LHPAs and CMAs in the interim.
