CLIMATEDOGS

The NSW Climatedog animation series uses humorous animations of sheep dogs to explain complex atmospheric phenomena to farmers. The series has been developed in collaboration with the <u>Australian Bureau of</u> <u>Meteorology</u> and <u>Victorian</u>

Department of Primary Industries.

Each of these dogs represents the main drivers of climate variability in NSW. 'Ridgy' otherwise known as the Subtropical Ridge is the lead dog of the pack. 'Enso' represents the El Nino Southern Oscillation phenomena, 'Indy' represents the Indian Ocean Dipole + 'Sam' the Southern Annular Mode. ACTION ON THE GROUND NOW LIVE

The Australian Government's Action on the Ground program has opened for applications this week. Applicants can apply for projects across a range of priority areas, including increasing soil carbon; reducing nitrous oxide emissions; reduced methane emissions and projects that have an innovative approach to increasing soil carbon. Round one of the program will provide up to \$25 million for on-ground projects in the agriculture sector.
