NEW INNOVATION GRANTS LOOK TO THE FUTURE

Grants of up to \$1.5 million are now available to help farmers prepare for the future by developing and adopting innovative practices and technologies.

The Innovation Grants under the Caring for our Country Sustainable Agriculture stream are available for agriculture, fishing, aquaculture and farm forestry industries.

Farming system groups, industry, agribusinesses, companies in the food supply chain, research bodies, community groups, universities and individuals are encouraged to apply. Partnerships or consortiums are also eligible.

Innovation Grant applications close 2pm (AEDT) on **4 July 2013**.

Beyond Blue have launched a new website. LOCAL LAND SERVICES PACKAGE ANNOUNCED

The full Local Land Services package has been announced by Minister Katrina Hodgkinson.

The key points are that: Boards will consist of 7 members of which a majority will be skills-based appointments, the remainder will be elected.

There will be 11 Local Land Services regions (with the insertion of a Central Tablelands region)

Forecast savings from the amalgamation will be directed to Agricultural Extension service.

All assets from the existing bodies will be pooled to create a LLS Future Fund.

In terms of the boards, Landcare NSW preferred a majority skilled/appointed board to ensure that a diverse mix of skills and experience will govern these organisations. The Legislation will still be required to pass the NSW Parliament and there may yet be some changes to the current proposal.

IPART REVIEW OF LLS

IPART has been tasked with reviewing the rating system applied to the Local Land Services bodies.

The starting point for the rating system is the current approach applied by the Livestock Health and Pest Authority.

The outcomes of this review will be provided to the Minister for Primary Industries, The Hon Katrina Hodgkinson.

The IPART review process will involve submissions and three public workshops, followed by the release of a further discussion paper and draft recommendations.

Landcare NSW will be developing a position paper for submission this month and will be attending the Sydney-based workshop.

Submissions are due on the 2^{nd} of July.
