The Australian Government is accepting applications for Round Two of the Biodiversity Fund.

The Biodiversity Fund is an ongoing program under the Australian Government's Land Sector Package of the Clean Energy Future plan. The overall objectives of the Biodiversity Fund are to help land managers establish, manage and enhance native vegetation on their land, increase our stores of carbon in the landscape and, in so doing, maintain ecosystem function and improve the resilience of

our ecosystems to the impacts of climate change.

The first investment round of the Biodiversity Fund was deliberately broad in its reach. targeted investment approach has been in announced Northern Australia and Round Two will extend this targeted approach to a number of priority areas across the country.
