forms of energy. As a result of population growth and climate change, the finite freshwater supplies become scarcer; hence the holistic and sustainable management of water resources is essential.

The 16th International River Symposium provides an opportunity to look at the linkages that rivers provide to water-energy-food. It will also allow dialogue to continue and build the knowledge base and capacity to inform policy decisions that must include trade-offs between river basin protection and sustainable water, energy and food security.

DROUGHT PROGRAMS AND RURAL ASSISTANCE

In the 2013 - 2014 Budget the Australian Government announced its contribution to National Drought Program Reform: \$99.4 million to be invested in a new Farm Household Allowance to support farmers and their partners when they are in hardship.

The new allowance will be available from 1 July 2014 and provide farm families experiencing financial hardship with assistance, without the need for a drought exceptional circumstances declaration. The allowance will provide eligible farmers and their partners with up to three years of fortnightly income at support paid a rate equivalent to Newstart Allowance (or Youth Allowance for those under 22).
