2013 COMMUNITY LITTER GRANTS

The Community Litter Grants are being managed by KABNSW in partnership with the NSW Environmental Protection Authority, and will enable community groups to tackle litter in local neighbourhoods.

The grants process has 2 stages. Stage 1 – Local Litter Check The collection of data using the Local Litter Check will help community groups identify the best actions to tackle litter in a chosen litter hot spot. Please note, only groups that complete Stage 1 and return their data will be eligible to apply for a grant. Groups who send KABNSW completed data will be reimbursed \$300.
