UPLAND WETLAND FIELD TRIP

BIO CARP CONTROL

Pest researchers say a biological control for carp is three years away. The CSIRO + the Invasive Animals CRC has produced favourable results from its biological control for carp program. The coy herpes virus is species specific + only attacks carp. The Invasive Animals CRC says it is seeking approval to

release the virus within the next few years.

'Daughterless' technology aims to control carp numbers by creating a fish population containing many more males than females. The project, which began in 2003, is a collaborative project between the Murray-Darling Basin Commission, CSIRO Marine Research + the Invasive Animals CRC.

BARBER'S POLE WORKSHOP

This diagnostic workshop is very suitable for owners / managers of smaller sheep and goat flocks + also relevant for larger operations for better control of drenching Barber's Pole worm. Topics explored include when to treat, how to correctly identify the small area in the lower inner evelid and how to use technology to better address the issue of drench resistance. \$8 MILLION WEED WARPATH

NSW Minister for Primary Industries, Katrina Hodakinson has announced \$8 million in funding to bolster weed management across NSW. The funding will be directed to the Weeds Action Grants Program + broader research +

development initiatives to control noxious weeds, improve agricultural productivity + protect the environment.

A total of 13 regional weed management projects have been funded.

By collaborating + targeting our efforts the program will focus on the likes of Serrated Tussock, Fireweed, Tropical Soda Apple + invasive aquatic weeds. In our area, Northern Inland Weeds Advisory Committee's Weed Action Program 2010-2015 has received \$1,047,515.
